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# POST Academy Launches a New Era

the One most exciting announcements of the spring was the creation of the CEI Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Academy. After years of advocacy, Idaho Falls—previously the largest city in Idaho without its own academyfinally has a local training hub for new officers and deputies. Located at CEI's Workforce Training Center. academy will serve 80 to 100 recruits annually and offer both a Detention Academy and a Patrol Academy.



With unanimous approval from the Idaho POST Council, and strong regional partnerships, this program is already reshaping law enforcement training in eastern Idaho. "CEI has been the best partner we could have ever hoped for," said Idaho Falls Police Chief Bryce Johnson.

The Detention Academy, which launched in April, trains individuals 18 and older to work in jails, while the Patrol Academy—starting in July—will include training in firearms, investigations, emergency vehicle operation, and scenario-based field simulations.

"This resource will mean major cost savings and a quicker turnaround for departments to get new officers hired and on the street," said Sgt. Bryan Lovell of the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office. Recruits will no longer need to travel to Pocatello or Meridian, reducing burdens on departments and families alike.

Trevor Elordi, CEI's VP of Workforce Training and a retired officer himself, sees this program as a "labor of love," emphasizing that the goal is not just training—it's preparing officers who are physically, mentally, and emotionally equipped to serve their communities. "We want them to experience realistic scenarios in a controlled environment, so they step into the job truly ready," he said.

POST at CEI is a bold investment in safety, service, and student opportunity—and alumni can take pride knowing their institution is leading the charge.



#### **Falcons Go National**

CEI Esports continues its winning streak—advancing to national competitions in Valorant, League of Legends, and Overwatch 2. What began as a student-led club has become a competitive team where students sharpen their skills, build community, and represent CEI on a national stage. The program continues to provide scholarship support and a platform for student success in and out of the arena. Esports is also drawing new students to campus who are excited to compete while earning a degree—making it a true win-win for CEI.







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


This state-of-the-art facility is more than a building—it represents CEI's bold vision for innovation and the future of technical education in eastern Idaho.
