STUDENT HIGHLIGHT

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT

WILSON CHANG

Like many students at CEI, Wilson Chang's path to an associate degree was not an easy one. But with the help of a CEI Foundation scholarship, and many of the wonderful services provided by the College, he graduates in December and has a bright future.

Five years ago, Wilson and his wife lived in Venezuela where he played guitar in a jazz band. In 2018, they had the opportunity, through a friend, to come to the U.S. and live in Idaho Falls. It didn't take long for Wilson to discover that a music career here was going to be difficult.

Wilson was always drawn to technology and after some research decided cybersecurity was the best route for him and his family. He started taking ESL courses at CEI to improve his English. Passing the GED soon followed. The Changs were excited to add a daughter to their family during this time as well.

In his first semester, Wilson took two courses and was holding down an A- grade in each just before the final exams. Around that same time, they took their baby to an ophthalmologist appointment to have her eyes checked. The examination discovered cataracts in one of her eyes. A visit to a specialist in Salt Lake City discovered something else—a cancerous tumor that needed to be removed immediately. The surgery was performed nine days later at Primary Children's Hospital in Salt Lake City. Wilson earned an A in both of his classes.

Wilson's second semester started with him explaining his family's situation to his professors and that he would be absent for some days because of it. Still, he was able to earn good grades and learn important things about building computers.

At the end of summer semester things were good for the Changs. Wilson continued to get good grades and their daughter, Laura, was growing, but an MRI showed that cancer had returned in her same eye.



Fall semester 2022 was an online experience for Wilson as the family temporarily moved to Salt Lake City for a month and a half while their baby received daily radiation treatments. But Wilson persevered despite this and continued to learn and keep his grades up.

Fortunately, Laura has been cancer-free for almost a year and Wilson says his academic performance has not been compromised. He said: "CEI is an important part of my professional and personal development. Throughout these years of studying, CEI has been there during the most critical moments of my life, and I have learned to be a better person, value knowledge, and have a vision of a better future for my family."

Wilson credits many of the student services offered by CEI with helping him succeed during such a challenging time of life, specifically: Center for

New Directions, College and Career Readiness, and scholarships awarded by the CEI Foundation. Without a scholarship he says it would have been very difficult to go to school and deal with his daughter's health scare. "A scholarship was a big deal for my family because we didn't have to worry about tuition very much. It was a great relief!"

What's next for Wilson? He is already an employee in CEI's IT Department as a support technician. Eventually he wants to earn a master's degree. Thanks to scholarships from the CEI Foundation, he has a solid foundation that will take him far.

INSTITUTION SINCE 1982?***

Accreditation is an ongoing, evidence-based process where CEI proves that it is fulfilling its mission to provide open access to affordable, quality education that meets the needs of students, regional employers, and the community.

Earlier this year, the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) performed an extensive study of CEI's institutional quality. As part of the evaluation process, CEI prepared and submitted several hefty documents evaluating areas such as finances, policies, and institutional effectiveness. A full review followed, including an external evaluation visit from its peers. The NWCCU issued a report to the College on July 21, 2023, that declared CEI is "substantially compliant" with all standards, policies, and eligibility requirements. In other words, we passed with flying colors!

CEI's continued accreditation shows that the college is a stellar, fiscally responsible educational institution.

The accreditation process also shows that CEI is committed to being a welcoming, data-informed campus whose graduates are respected and sought by our regional employers. Our students choose us to become highly trained employees, leaders, and entrepreneurs.

CEI faculty and staff work every day to meet their ambitions. The College has built assessment protocols, financial policies, and other safeguards to ensure that this is a sustainable institution now and that its credentials will be valuable long into the future.

Each year the Foundation can offer more scholarship opportunities to students because of the meticulous planning and care that goes into Swing for the Green. IDAHO LAUNCH

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

This past session, the Idaho Legislature passed a bill to create Idaho LAUNCH. This is an incentive to help students pay their tuition if they enroll in high-demand majors. What defines “high demand” is to be determined, but most CEI programs will qualify. Here are the basics of the program:

Idaho LAUNCH awards up to **80%** or **\$8,000** in tuition for a student graduating high school in Idaho in 2024 or later who is taking an “in-demand” major. This will cover most of the tuition for most CEI students who qualify.



PLEASE NOTE: Students graduating high school in 2023 or earlier will not be able to access Idaho LAUNCH funds. These students will be the focus of CEI Foundation scholarships moving forward. Only 17% of students who applied for CEI Foundation scholarships this year were recent high school graduates. There is still a need for scholarship donations to help students who will not be able to access Idaho LAUNCH funds.

BY GIVING TO THE CEI FOUNDATION YOU CAN EARN AN IDAHO TAX CREDIT

DID YOU KNOW THAT YOU COULD EARN A TAX CREDIT ON YOUR IDAHO TAXES JUST BY GIVING TO THE CEI FOUNDATION?

Idaho allows you to give monetary contributions to certain educational and cultural organizations while reducing the amount of state income tax you owe. This is a tax *credit* you can take even if you don't itemize. Contributions are reduced by the value of anything you receive in return such as food, entertainment, or merchandise. You can claim the credit on your Idaho income tax return for the year when you made the contribution(s).

For C and S corporations, the law limits the yearly credit to the smallest of:

- **\$5,000**
- **10% of total income tax or franchise tax owed for the year.**
- **50% of the amount donated.**

For all other businesses, individuals, and entities (such as estates and trusts), the law limits the yearly credit to the smallest of:

- **\$500 per taxpayer** (\$1,000 total for married individuals filing jointly)
- **50% of total income tax** (For example, the amount on Form 40, line 21, for Idaho resident individuals)
- **50% of the amount donated.**

Talk to your tax advisor or contact the Idaho State Tax Commission if you have questions about this credit.
