A WORD FROM THE COLLEGE PRESIDENT



The College of Eastern Idaho continues its upward trajectory. I feel privileged that we are growing our student body and the College's recognition as a place of opportunity in this region. During the 2021-22 academic year, CEI served over 21,200 credit and non-credit (including workforce training) students. This includes more than 3,200 credit-seeking students, an increase of 23 percent from the prior academic year. And of those 3,200, more than 1,300 were early college students, which is an increase of 56 percent from the prior academic year. Notably, our student population has continued to grow while many of our higher education peers, have experienced enrollment

declines. CEI recently received a 40,000 sq. ft. trades building from Bonneville County Commissioners and City of Idaho Falls. We have named the building Eastern Idaho Workforce Training Center (EIWTC). It will be used for workforce and trades training.

The strategic direction taken by our programs have continued to bear fruit. For example, CEI was chosen as a national finalist in the Lumina Foundation's Million Dollar Community College Challenge, wining \$100,000 for our branding and marketing work. The College also received glowing praise from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) on our year-six accreditation Report. Both of these milestones took incredible work, indicate we are headed in the right direction, and applauds the work our staff and faculty do every day.

BETSEY PITTS

Richard and Lila Jordan Faculty Member of the Year

The list of Betsey Pitts' incredible accomplishments and commitments as a Math instructor is long. She spearheaded the development of a Math class that helps students who are not strong in Math move forward in their program and decrease time to degree. She was an early adopter of "light board" technology at CEI, and created short videos for her students who missed class for health reasons or other issues and posted them online so students wouldn't fall behind. Student comments on these course reviews state that they have "never had a Math teacher like Betsey" and that they "finally understand math after struggling with it before."





BRAD ROTHWELL

Outstanding Adjunct Faculty Award

CEI's adjuncts hold a full-time job somewhere in the community then teach one or more courses online or in the classroom, usually at night. The College relies on adjunct faculty to fulfill our mission and provide quality teaching and learning opportunities for students. The winner of the inaugural award for outstanding adjunct faculty, Brad Rothwell, teaches some of the College's Cybersecurity courses. Brad's awards and certifications are too numerous to mention here, (including several as a Certified Ethical Hacker!) but I think what is most important to point out is that his students have a TSA (Security+) pass rate above 90.

RUBY TAYLOR

Outstanding Staff Member of the Year

CEI has really good people. In the letters nominating Ruby Taylor from the CEI Human Resources office for Outstanding Staff Member, sentiments such as these were common: to know her is to love her; kind, understanding, and helpful; and a ray of sunshine. Nothing more can be said, except perhaps to express how grateful CEI is to have Ruby on our team!





When EITC officially transitioned to the College of Eastern Idaho (CEI) the State Board of Education turned over the ownership of the existing 60 acres of campus property and the buildings to the local Board of Trustees. This was a tremendous gain for our entire eastern Idaho community.

With jobs in our region demanding trained technicians, and with the interests of our students at heart, the College began dreaming of a building on campus where state-of-the-art technical training takes place.



That led CEI to the idea of Future Tech, a new career technical education (CTE) building that is the first of its kind in eastern Idaho. It is designed specifically for training a future workforce, beginning as early as high school.

Programs taught in the Future Tech building will earn students an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) and



an industry certification. The new facility will also include employer-directed training through CEI's Workforce Training Department. In total, over 1,000 students can be trained and educated in this building annually, making a significant impact on employment opportunities and economic prospects for people and communities in Idaho.

In many cases, students who graduate and join regional employers will earn starting salaries of \$27-30 per hour plus benefits. About \$34 million has already been raised for Future Tech and \$8 million is need to complete construction. This building will be an integral part of the eastern Idaho community. We hope everyone in our community will support the construction of Future Tech and attend classes or events in the building!

COMMUNITY COLLEGE CHALLENGE

On August 17, the College of Eastern Idaho was named one of nine runners-up in The Million Dollar Community College Challenge by the Lumina Foundation to support strategic marketing and brandbuilding. Madera Community College was named The Million Dollar winner, and the nine runners-up were highlighted in a video announcement.

CEI will receive a \$100,000 grant and technical

assistance from Noetic Consultants and Statwax to support the college's brand and marketing goals. Hundreds of community colleges nationwide applied for the Challenge, and in April, CEI was named one of 10 finalists.

CEI President Rick Aman said, "College of Eastern Idaho is truly honored to be selected as a finalist in The Million Dollar Community College Challenge, especially as a new and smaller community college. We will use the funding

to both brand the college as accessible and affordable, but also remind our region we are engineered so that working adults with real-life responsibilities achieve their chosen degrees and/or high-quality credentials."

In Round 1 of the competition, applicants were required to answer several questions, telling the story of what makes their college unique and exceptional, and what they would do with a million dollars to amplify and improve their brands. In Round 2, the finalists created video narratives and supporting written documents, communicating their value proposition for adult learners. Lumina Foundation sought videos that would creatively convince adult students that attending

RECIPIENT HIGHLIGHT Jennie Miller

CEI Foundation scholarship recipient Jennie Miller may not be able to juggle pool balls or torches, but she is married with six kids and is a full-time student so she juggles life.

Jennie's world used to be centered on the other side of Idaho in the Treasure Valley. She got married, started a family, went to cosmetology school, and was a high school dance team coach for several years. Life was good, but a change was coming her way. She felt that Nursing was her true calling and started taking classes as College of Western Idaho.

"My mom was a nurse so it was always on my radar," she says. Her mom had a medical emergency and it reminded her how nurses help people. "When I was a patient, having my babies, and when my mom was in the hospital, I saw how nurses impact people."

In August of 2021 her family moved to Idaho Falls. That and the birth of her sixth child soon after put her nursing plans on hold. "Being a wife and mom is my number one priority. But being educated is also important."

Jennie feels there is more to her educational experience than what she will take from it. She recognizes the impact it can have on her children, ages 13 down to 1. "It shows my kids that they can be part of a big family and be educated, and that they can go after their ambitions."

Sacrifice is another important part of the experience. Everyone has to make some kind of sacrifice. There are some of the kids' activities that she can't make because of homework. But that is OK. She wants to be an example to her kids that they too can struggle to work and do things that are hard.

As the coach of a high school dance team Jennie could tell which team members had to work hard in other areas of their lives and which ones had life easy.

While difficult, Jennie's CEI experience has been positive. Even though re-learning how to go back to school has its challenges, especially getting a handle on technology, she found the teachers helpful and responsive, and the class sizes have not been overwhelming.

The scholarship she received from the CEI Foundation provides extra motivation. She feels that someone else is counting on her to do her best. Her

> scholarship also helped reduce stress by lowering her relian on debt, and helped her feel like her support team is expanded.

After graduation she wants to be a labor and delivery nurse since she loves being with moms and babies at one of the most happy and

exciting times of their lives. "Being with babies comes very natural to me. Experience with my babies will help me do this well."

When asked what she would tell her donor if she was able to meet him or her, Jennie's first response was to say "thank you." She followed that with saying that when she is a nurse someday, she hoped her donor would feel the benefit of their donation, not just in the way it helped her, but with all of the patients she will help.
