








My education is a little unconventional and I think a lot of our students feel the same. I graduated high school (barely) and thought that was it. I wanted nothing else to do with school. I had a good job at a fabrication shop and worked my way up each summer throughout high school, and now that I had graduated, I could really make some money.

Years later, I had topped out in my career and could not advance any higher without further education, so I came

to Eastern Idaho Technical College (EITC, now CEI) with the mindset that I was just going to get that paper degree. I was amazed to find that even after working for eight years in the welding industry, I still had so much to learn, and that my instructors, Corey Shurtliff and Tomy Ogawa, were so willing and motivated to help improve

my skills and knowledge. Needless to say, I **EARNED** my Associate Degree in Applied Science in welding technology.

During my last semester prior to graduation, Corey called me into his office. He had received a phone call from my old high school welding teacher, Ed Kopp, who was looking for a replacement as he was getting ready to retire in a few years. So, I went over to Bonneville High School to talk with Ed and try my hand at co-instructing his students for a couple of Fridays. I fell in love; teaching was so rewarding. Much like building a metal product with my hands in a fabrication shop, teaching and seeing students excel gives me the same gratification.

I've been at the College full time for six years now, and the growth has not slowed down. The welding program has taken over the old diesel shop to expand the booth layout and move

> equipment into a better flow for production, much like you would see in an industry setting.

If I could give students advice about college I would recommend they pay attention in school, master the basics (math, English, science), and

remember that they don't know everything. We are all consistently learning. We are human,

and we all make mistakes, so don't get defeated. Just pick yourself up, and learn from it. 2010

Her community service work advocates connecting mothers with postpartum resources through education and community connection to reduce the stigma surrounding postpartum anxiety and depression. This reflects her long-term goal of becoming a nurse practitioner specializing in women's and family health. She is able to bring her message of compassion and empowerment to a national audience while simultaneously representing our great state.

She is currently enrolled in CEI's Registered Nursing (RN) program and is working as a Certified Nursing Assistant at Mountain View Hospital and at Idaho Falls Community Hospital.

Ellie praises CEI's accessibility, affordability, and the wide range of scholarships available. When asked about her advice for future students, she stated "Don't be afraid to ask questions and get out of your comfort zone. Your success matters here." Ellie's passion for her patients, and her community is proving that one person can make a meaningful difference.

COLLEGE OF EASTERN IDAHO ANNOUNCES PARTNERSHIP TO LAUNCH FUTURE TECH BUILDING, APPLIED STEM INSTITUTE

The College of Eastern Idaho (CEI), in partnership with Battelle Energy Alliance (BEA) and Frontier Credit Union, is launching a new chapter in workforce development and STEM education. This joint effort includes constructing the Future Tech Building, and creating the BEA Applied STEM Institute and Frontier Credit Union's STEM Scholarship initiative. The facility will be formally known as the Battelle Energy Alliance Future Tech Building in partnership with Frontier Credit Union.

"This is a transformative moment for CEI and our community," said CEI President Lori Barber. "The generous contributions from BEA and Frontier Credit Union will provide our students with the tools, mentorship and opportunities they need to thrive in the evolving energy and technology sectors. These investments directly support Idaho's workforce and economic future."

The 88,000-square-foot Future Tech Building will house advanced labs, collaborative classrooms and the BEA Applied STEM Institute, an innovative program to connect students with real-world learning and career pathways in science, technology, engineering and math.

Frontier Credit Union will hold naming rights to a 4,087-square-foot

conference space for STEM expert lectures that will also be available for rental as a meeting venue for the broader community.

Battelle Energy Alliance, which manages the Idaho National Laboratory (INL), is investing an additional \$4.5 million to support the facility and launch the BEA Applied STEM Institute. This contribution builds on BEA's \$1 million contribution in 2022 for the facility's construction, bringing the total donation to \$5.5 million. "This partnership with CEI and Frontier Credit Union directly supports our vision to change the world's energy future and secure our nation's critical infrastructure," said INL Director John Wagner. "The Future Tech Building and BEA Applied STEM Institute will help build the talent pipeline – right here in Idaho – essential to American prosperity."

Frontier Credit Union is contributing \$3.5 million to the project, and this fall will establish a dedicated STEM scholarship program



for CEI students through its new Frontier Scholarship Program. Frontier will also launch co-branded debit and credit cards with CEI, with interchange revenue directly funding the scholarship initiative reinforcing its commitment to education access across Idaho.

"As Frontier Credit Union celebrates 90 years of building better lives in Idaho, this partnership with CEI and BEA exemplifies our enduring mission to uplift communities through innovation, education and opportunity," said Frontier Credit Union CEO Dan Thurman. "By investing in the Future Tech Building, launching the Frontier Scholarship Program and creating the Frontier Conference Center, we are helping ensure Idaho students, especially those pursuing STEM, have the resources and support they need to thrive. Together we are laying the foundation for the next 90 years of progress and impact."

"This year, BEA is celebrating 20 years of dedication to Idaho's communities. This additional investment supports our mission to create tangible impacts for the people we serve and grow the next generation of innovators," said BEA Executive Vice President of Laboratory Operations Juan Alvarez. "The BEA Applied STEM Institute will serve as a central access point for educators, students, community leaders and industry partners to drive applied programming to serve future workforce needs."

CEI is scheduled to open the Future Tech Building, the BEA Applied STEM Institute and the Frontier Credit Union Conference Center in Fall 2026.

BY GIVING TO THE CEI FOUNDATION YOU CAN EARN AN IDAHO TAX CREDIT

DID YOU KNOW THAT YOU COULD EARN A TAX CREDIT ON YOUR IDAHO TAXES JUST BY GIVING TO THE CEI FOUNDATION?

Idaho allows you to contribute to certain educational and cultural organizations while reducing the amount of state income tax you owe. This is a tax credit you can take even if you don't itemize. Contributions are reduced by the value of anything you receive in return such as food, entertainment, or merchandise. You can claim the credit on your Idaho income tax return for the year when you made the contribution(s).

For C and S corporations, the law limits the yearly credit to the smallest of:

- \$5,000
- 10% of total income tax or franchise tax owed for the year.
- **50%** of the amount donated.

For all other businesses, individuals, and entities (such as estates and trusts), the law limits the yearly credit to the smallest of:

- \$500 per taxpayer (\$1,000 total for married individuals filing jointly)
- 50% of total income tax (For example, the amount on Form 40, line 21, for Idaho resident individuals)
- 50% of the amount donated.



MARY LYNN DONOR HIGHLIGHT

Mary Lynn Hartwell is a cherished supporter of College of Eastern Idaho (CEI). As a member of the College's Finance Committee and a former board member of the CEI Foundation, Mary Lynn is practiced at uplifting people and building a stronger community through her time, talent and resources.

Her philanthropic interests have included CEI for many years. Mary Lynn, along with her late husband, Ralph, recognized the transformative power of higher education early on. Decades ago, they established a scholarship that continues to support CEI students annually.

Over the years, employees at their company, The Hartwell Corporation, one of Idaho's largest independent insurance agencies, also benefited from CEI's vocational training programs. This experience reinforced the Hartwell's belief in education as a pathway to opportunity. Though she did not attend CEI herself, Mary Lynn sees the institution as a vital resource that makes education accessible and attainable.

Her generosity stems from a desire to make a meaningful difference. In fact, Mary Lynn committed a leadership gift early in the planning stages for the BEA Future Tech Building in Partnership with Frontier Credit Union. The space in this new CEI building, and the people who helped make it a reality, will be celebrated when it opens in summer 2026 (see page 8).

She encourages others to give

to CEI, citing its affordability, strong

academic foundation, and visible impact on students' lives. "It's a great starting place," she says, "you see the students all around the area in business, industry and healthcare, and you see that education really works and what the payoff is to your gift."

Mary Lynn calls CEI "a crown jewel of East Idaho," a testament to her belief in the College's role in our local community and economy. Her philanthropy exemplifies the spirit of giving, echoing Nelson Henderson's wisdom: "The true meaning of life is to plant trees, under whose shade you do not expect to sit."
